fireplace. All this thanks to Piers Robinette who assured me, recently, that all would be right on the night!



PARISH COUNCIL MEETING

At the meeting on 4th December the Council set the Precept for the next financial year. It was decided to keep it at the same rate as last year with money put aside in case the Council might need to get professional help with their possible objections to the proposal to build 1500 homes between Henley and Westerfield Roads.

A new Police Liaison Officer has been appointed to Tuddenham. PC 814, Judith Holton, is based at Woodbridge Police Station.

The bus stop has been successfully moved back onto its base after a recent road traffic accident. The bench has had to be replaced. It is hoped that this work will be covered by insurance.

The bus stop sign has been removed from the post outside Geranium Cottage but the Council have been assured by Gary Trotter at Suffolk County Council that this does not mean there is any change in service. The site remains a bus stop and a new sign will be put up. The existing bus service is on a limited contract however, and it is hoped that a new one will be arranged by January or February.

The playground changes are well on the way and you are welcome to inspect them. More funds are needed and if you would like to help raise any please contact Sandy Burns.

There were various concerns voiced about the quality of the road surface in the centre of the village and this is to be followed up by our new County Councillor, Steven Hudson.

The Parish Clerk is to seek a new dog bin for the start to Green Lane. Speed checks requested from the Police by the Council have been denied as there "is no speed problem in the village". Apparently there have not been enough accidents though the Inspector did acknowledge there is a high traffic volume. Re-

cent checks have revealed that only 10 out of 4000 cars monitored would be liable to prosecution for exceeding the speed limit.

The was much discussion regarding the proposals to build 1500 houses between Westerfield and Ipswich. Following the meeting two Councillors and the Clerk have attended another meeting which is reported elsewhere in The Tattler.

The next meeting is on 5th March at 7.30 pm in the Village Hall. All are welcome.

Westerfield Meeting

On 26th November a meeting was held at Westerfield initiated by S.O.C.S (Save Our Country Spaces) and chaired by Sir Michael Lord MP.

Jim Punton attended as representative for Tuddenham and he reported back to the Parish Council on this meeting.

A further meeting was held on 10th December in Westerfield regarding the proposed housing between Westerfield and Ipswich and this was attended by Bill Pipe, Philip Harvey and Arthur Jackson, our Parish Clerk to represent Tuddenham. Also represented were Westerfield, Otley, Great Bealings, Playford and Grundisburgh, Parish Councils.

It was noted that objections to the proposals have to be lodged with Ipswich Borough Council by 18th January.

It was accepted at the meeting that the need for extra housing in Ipswich, despite the projected fall in population, was part of the structure plan and could not be challenged.

Use of "brownfield sites" was applauded but coulld only satisfy 80% of the new housing needed.

The redistribution of traffic consequent on the closure of the Westerfield Level Crossing needs to be made public and is a possible objection. It may lead to a rise in traffic on Lower Road and Church Lane, Westerfield, as well as a rise in Tuddenham traffic.






Here's a great place for a Winter drink by a roaring fire sitting next to unspoilt river views.


